#### **Council News**

In response to a request the Parish Council is purchasing some litter pickers. The idea is that you can pick one up and pick up any litter you see as you walk around the village. They will be available to borrow from the Clerk. NB you are responsible for your own safety.

# "Bump" Up Your Support for Road Safety run by Lincolnshire Police

Speed is a major problem in our village and drivers are being asked to "bump" up their commitment to safer driving by displaying a #SlowDownInLincolnshire bumper sticker on their vehicle as part of a new road safety campaign by Lincolnshire Police.

Run in partnership with the Lincolnshire Road Safety Partnership (LRSP), it aims to cut the number of people killed or seriously injured in road collisions in Lincolnshire. During 2020 there were 52 fatalities and an additional 394 people seriously injured on county roads.

If average speeds fell by 1% the number of crashes on our roads would fall by 5%. Tackling speeding is an important priority for the residents, which is why as a Force Lincolnshire Police are rolling this out county-wide.

The stickers can be collected from police stations across the county including Sleaford and displayed either on the rear bumper or windscreen of a car, van, farming machinery, motorcycle, or other larger fleet vehicles, and will also be handed out by local Neighbourhood Policing Teams.

People are also asked to support by sharing social media posts, using #SlowDownInLincolnshire and #drivesafelincs. Drivers are encouraged to take a photo of their vehicle displaying the sticker and tag in their local policing team to help promote the project.
