PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

At the September meeting of the Parish Council there was a presentation to Eric Hickman in appreciation of 18 years service in various posts, ending up as chairman, before retiring from the fray. Various other matters were discussed and the sale of the allotments to Mr Peter Green were noted. Mr Alex Harper attended as a member of the public and generously offered to provide flower troughs to be placed near the sign posts at both ends of the village. The Council accepted his offer but wanted to double check with the Lincs. County Council first before giving him the go ahead.

At the October meeting we were told that the traffic calming measures were to commence after road repairs had been completed in November. The sale of the allotments should be finalised any day now and as the money is earmarked for a new village hall, it was agreed a public meeting would need to be called so that the wishes of the community could be considered. Finally, the County Council had agreed to Mr Harpers plan for flower troughs and his offer will be gratefully accepted.
