A Parish Council meeting was held on 15th March in the village hall. Councillor D. Dickinson of NKDC and three members of the public also attended. A resident had raised various issues in a letter to the council and these were discussed as follows; (1) The village notice board was displaced during some repairs by BT. The parish council have notified BT but so far with no result. (2) The damaged seat opposite the 'Coach House' is to be repaired 'as soon as possible'. (3) The Church Lane sign on the church wall needed repairing - this has now been done. (4) Signs on green boards at each end of the village are now incorrect and should be amended. The District Council are responsible for these signs and Cllr Dickinson said he would investigate the matter. (5) A Village Hall direction sign is needed but apparently the position to place it is 'difficult'.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS (12th JULY)

There was a very disappointing turn out of residents for the meeting which had planned a discussion on the 'Neighbourhood Watch' scheme with speakers from the police and Neighbourhood Watch. The presence of such a scheme in a village can affect insurance premiums for residents but also helps for peace of mind, knowing that a co-ordinator will pass on a message from the police (about bogus callers for instance). There is also a special Farm and Country Watch. This is a free service for farmers to link into. See the enclosed leaflet concerning a further meeting on 11th October.

Further items discussed such as the cutting of the grass regularly at the 'Triangle'. This will be done by North Kyme Workshops (Japp) and will be part funded by the Parish Council. The notice board on the picnic area is expected to be finished soon. The village inspection was planned for 16th August. (This took place on 25th August with the Parish Council and a Highways official looking at blocked gullies etc. A full report is awaited.) Next meeting 4th October at 7.30pm.
