PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Meeting held on 27th July - Seven councillors attended.

David Dickinson (NKDC) and four members of the public were also present. Items raised by residents in the 'Open Forum' were as follows - 1) Information boards at each end of the village ; 2) Fencing needed round the new field; 3) The possibility of the school being used as a village hall.

After some discussion, Mr Dickinson agreed to look into the problem about the boards with the council body responsible.

The fencing around the field was discussed and 300 hawthorn and other hedging plants will be provided in the autumn. The PC agreed to consult with the Education Authority regarding the use of the school.

The PC agreed to support the North Kyme newsletter again this year and allocated £80 towards running costs.

A grant of £200 was also made to the church as a contribution towards their maintenance costs.

A village inspection was planned and took place on 17th August. Various items were earmarked to be looked at on the inspection including an overgrown hedge, partly blocking the pavement, a large tree blocking light from a street lamp and a noisy drain cover on Main Street.

The next meeting is planned for 21st September in the village hall.

ARE YOU OVER 50...? - IF SO READ ON.....

There is a scheme to help older people stay fit and the idea is to have fun with exercises set to music. The intention is not for a punishing schedule that leaves you gasping for breath! The plan is for gentle exercise that will get your circulation going in a relaxed atmosphere. It will be of particular benefit in the winter months when it is sometimes difficult to get out walking. ASBO OPEN FORUM

The above meeting was open to anyone involved with their community or interested in finding out about anti social behaviour orders and how they can work. The panel comprised local police and an NKDC anti social behaviour team. Five local residents from North Kyme were amongst those attending the meeting. The main thrust seemed to be that community police officers should always be notified of any incidents, even fairly trivial things that could be described as causing harassment, alarm or distress. This behaviour can be referred to a

team and will be assessed and recorded to build a true picture. A diary may even be issued so that records of dates and times could be kept. There is a plan for 59 community teams across Lincs within a year, with Sleaford having two such teams. The police on these teams work by consent within the community and also use volunteer support to aid in identifying problems. Our local community police officers number is 832222 so please report any incidents you see.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Parish Council meeting held on 21st September.

Five councillors attended and six members of the public.

A large tree blocking a street lamp on Vacherie Lane was remarked upon. It was agreed to write to NKDC concerning the boards giving wrong information and ask if they will turn over the maintenance of these signs to the parish council.

Both of these items were brought to the attention of the parish council back in July. The lamp is still obscured as this newsletter goes to print.

A member of the public enquired if the village could use the school and the parish council stated that the Education Authority have to get market value from all assets and the cost would be too high. The building is deemed unsuitable for public use from a health and safety aspect.

Another resident asked if it was possible to have the 30 MPH signs positioned further outside the village, the PC will request resiting of these signs from the authorities. There was some discussion regarding mowing of grass in the parish and quotations will be sought from various sources. Lastly, the mobile catering unit in the 'layby' has had planning permission refused but an appeal is in place.
