Foot way Lighting Programme 05/06 - Work on hold as EME propose an underground scheme for the village which could affect NKDC's supply proposals.

Village Inspection Report - 17 August 05

Main Street

No.33 - the provision of an additional road gully to be investigated.

Kerbs to the entrance of Burdens require attention.

Weeds were noted growing through the new foot way to Mill Lane.

Low gully outside No 17, causing vibration.

Following completion of works to the footway on the west side, consideration to be given to foot ways on the eastern side.

Anglian Water manhole o/s No 51 requires reinstatement also o/s 75 and 81 require attention.

Anglian Water reinstatement in foot way o/s 73 requires attention.

Encroachment of the grass verge over the rear of the foot way from the village to Ferry Lane requires cutting back.

Church Lane

Flooding reported opposite entrance to the pub, this however was much reduced following the previous works and receded quite quickly.

Vacherie Lane

Junction of Newfield Drive foot way needs repair.

These issues will be investigated, prioritised and actioned accordingly.

VILLAGE HALL COMMITTEE AGM

The annual general meeting was attended by a small audience of interested residents and they were made very welcome with tea and biscuits.

The annual accounts showed a healthy bank balance and full details have been displayed on the two notice boards in the village. An interesting point was raised concerning the finances of the hall and the large amount of money spent on 'utilities' (£1481 : 68). This figure included £850 per annum for insurance, something we have to pay and can't economise on. It can be seen from this item alone just how much money is needed to keep the hall ticking over. This of course is what your committee are striving to do and we hope to entertain you at the same time!

During the last 12 months the actual number of people crossing the threshold to attend events in the hall came to a staggering 5,000+. This shows just how well the hall is used and needed every week of the year. However, it should be noted that the hall is available for hire at very reasonable rates for private functions or if you wish to start a club of some kind there are vacant hours during the week. We are always very pleased to see a new venture starting or an enthusiasts club of some sort. The committee would be ready to give advice on any ideas you have and to help you get started.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Five councillors attended plus the clerk.

A very small number of residents attended the meeting and during question time one asked if anything could be done to slow traffic down on Main St. After some discussion it was decided that enquiries would be made of the Road Safety Partnership regarding different methods available.

A resident had previously asked if the 30 mile per hour sign on the Sleaford Road could be moved further down towards Sleaford. The highways dept. Have said this sign will not be moved but a 40 miles per hour sign will be placed 440 metres before the 30 sign and another will be placed 270 metres into Ferry Lane. Hopefully this will slow traffic before it comes upon the 30mph sign in the village. The next meeting will be on 22nd March at 7.30pm.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY L.I.V.E.S. !

Just over three years ago (Easter 2003) following sterling fund raising by Nick Lamb, Glynn Pout and a grant from the E.U., the North Kyme, South Kyme and Billingham group of L.I.V.E.S. was launched.

As some readers will already know the group of 'first responders' are all volunteers who, on a rota basis, supplement Lincolnshire Ambulance Service by responding to 999 calls for heart attacks, breathing difficulties etc. when an ambulance is more than 5 minutes away. In Lincolnshire the survival rate from a heart attack when a Responder has been on scene is three times higher than nationally. The first 8 minutes after the attack are crucial, we aim (and succeed) at being on scene within that 8 minutes time frame. The group has recently been called out to Anwick, North Kyme, South Kyme and Billingham and over the three year period has responded on over 60 occasions - that is 60 people in this area who have been helped by either receiving oxygen, CPR, or other support before the ambulance arrived.

However all is not well - the group is struggling for members and this means that sometimes we are not able to offer the 24 hour cover that we would like. We desperately need new volunteers to train as responders (excellent training is provided by L.I.V.E.S. HQ in Horncastle) OR as a group supporter to help raise funds, etc. Both roles are essential to the running of the group especially as we receive NO NHS FUNDING! If you can help please contact Anne Freeston on 01526 861796, - you never know when **you might need us - now we need you!**

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Meeting held on 22nd March in the village hall, five councillors attended plus Mr David Dickinson and the parish clerk, four members of the public also attended.

During the open forum at the beginning of the meeting, a resident enquired about the emptying of waste bins on the 'Triangle' and opposite the Coach House Motel. These were very often full to overflowing and didn't seem to be regularly emptied. After some discussion, the parish council agreed to check the frequency of the emptying of these bins and report back at the next meeting.

During the meeting it was noted that NKDC planning applications will now be made available for public viewing at local access points and information links. A planning application had been turned down for the mobile food unit at the triangle but an appeal had been lodged. NKDC have a new client operations manager for environment studies attached to environmental services, a Ms. Jenny Bailey.

In 'any other business' it was noted that grass cutting will shortly be taking place on the new playing field which will hopefully make cricket matches a possibility soon.

The next meeting will be held on 31st May at 7.30pm.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS (AGM - 31/5/06)

When the meeting opened the chairman thanked councillors and clerk for twelve months work. The chairman, vice-chair and treasurer were re-elected and the councillors also stay the same, the list is as follows;-

The annual accounts were not available for the meeting.

After the AGM an ordinary meeting was held.

The grass cutting on village sites was discussed and it was agreed that areas, such as the 'Triangle' and the Millennium Stone need to be put on a firmer routine. A long discussion was held about the Open Day on 16th July and an exhibition and display of the plans for the new village hall was agreed (see enclosure). There were requests for donations from the parish council as follows; First Responders asked for help as their training needs come to £1500 : 00 per annum. The council allocated £150. St Luke's churchyard maintenance was allocated £200. The date for the annual audit of the p.c. will be on 31st July. Finally, a footpath was mooted between North Kyme and Billingham but the County Council had vetoed this suggestion, the cost would be approximately £100,000, the council claimed and this would not be justified. The parish council agreed the project was not feasible.

PUBLIC MEETING REPORT

On Sunday 16th July a Public Meeting and Open Day gave parishioners a chance to see the plans for the new hall. Various comments and suggestions were made and taken into account. The 'Buy a Brick' scheme was launched and raised £150 straight away.

If you 'buy a brick' for our new village hall, each donation will be listed in a book. Every pound given will buy one ticket to go in a prize draw for £100 on the opening day of the new hall. Donors can write their name on the brick wall display board in the village hall. Donations can be made to any committee member or during any hall function.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS A parish council meeting was held on 26th July. Four councillors were present plus NKDC councillor David Dickinson. Five members of the public attended.

Mrs Elizabeth Waters stated, during the public forum, that she found herself unable to continue with the maintenance of the flower boxes, not least because she found the NKDC grass cutting schedule too infrequent to keep the boxes looking nice. The chairman thanked her for her efforts in the past.

NKDC had notified the parish council that if the parish employs a dog warden they would pay 34 pence per head of the population or 80% of the cost (whichever was the least). This offer was not taken up.

It was decided to apply for more hedging for the sports field from the free trees for parishes scheme.

The parish council unanimously agreed a donation of £80 towards the annual running costs of the North Kyme News.

Finally, the parish council will soon have a vacancy and anyone interested in becoming a councillor should contact the chairman, Mr. G.Panton 860598 or the clerk, Mrs Judith Johnson 861293. Next meeting 27th September 7.30pm

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Parish Council meeting 4th October - 5 councillors and 4 members of the public were present. Cllr D Dickinson NKDC also in attendance.

Cllr. M Mawson has tendered his resignation because of work commitments, Three applications have been received for the vacant position, one of which was rejected because the applicant lives outside the parish.

During the public forum a resident asked about the poor street lighting on Church Lane. The PC will look into this again as some work is taking place at a different site. Another light has also been requested near the layby at the end of Main Street.

The question of speeding traffic was raised - a resident described a community project in Shropshire involving residents monitoring the speed of traffic with the aid of radar guns. Volunteers wear special jackets and official notices are placed to warn drivers - all this with the support of the local police. Even short periods of monitoring had produced dramatic reductions in speeds through villages.

Questioned about the new village hall project, the chairman said that plans were almost ready to be submitted for planning permission, this being done we can then forge ahead. Meanwhile a grant of £2500 has been promised, by the Central Networks Safer Environment Fund for fencing and gates on the project, this was applied for by Mr T Carroll.

L.I.V.E.S. Volunteer Mrs Ann Freeston has had to relinquish her post as she is leaving the district shortly. The work she has done is very much appreciated, she deserves a very big 'Thank you' from all of us. Luckily a new co-ordinator and five new volunteers have been recruited locally.
