PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Meeting 9th January 2008

Seven councillors, the clerk, Cllr.M.Powell (NKDC) and two members of the public were present.

The issue of dog fouling, on Vacherie Lane in particular, was raised by a parishioner. Councillors stated that fines can be imposed if the owner is traced. The Council were given details of the cost of a 'youth shelter' and grants available but no further action is to be taken at this time due to lack of funds.

It is anticipated that the green 'gateway' signs at each end of the village, previously the responsibility of NKDC, will be taken over by the Parish Council very soon.

An application for an increase of 5% in the precept for this year will be made, bringing the total to £2100.

Repairs and maintenance to gullies and to the road surface on Church Lane and Main Street will take place later this year. The provision of parking spaces outside the bungalows on Vacherie Lane is considered desirable but low priority.

A 'cluster' meeting of the seven parish councils in the area will be held on 23rd January. Among items for discussion will be the purchase of portable electronic speed limit signs for shared use in the villages concerned.

EXTRAORDINARY MEETING 27th FEBRUARY 2008

The meeting was called concerning proposed housing to be built on the old school site.

Present at the meeting were parish councillors and NKDC district councillor Mr.M.Powell. Mr Clive Wickes, the architect for the site represented the developers. The meeting was well attended by approximately 70 residents. The planning department were also invited but declined to attend.

Plans were available for everyone to see the actual layout of the site and number of houses planned etc. We were told that the access had been agreed with the highways dept. and that the government edict of 20 houses to the acre had been adhered to. We were also told that the developer would be willing to give approximately £10,000 towards play equipment or something similar and there would be a contribution towards schools in Billingham (?) or Sleaford possibly.

When the meeting was thrown open to the floor many villagers made plain their feelings on most of the issues. To sum up, the main ones appeared to be; (a) 23 houses is too many for the site; (b) the access and egress to the site would just add to the traffic difficulties already being experienced in North Kyme, and (c) the type of housing planned is not deemed suitable for the character of the village. It was also felt that the provision of a light controlled pedestrian crossing would be vital.

MEETING 30th APRIL

Seven councillors present plus District Councillor Mike Powell

The meeting was told that letters to the parish clerk (Judith Johnson) had gone unanswered and her intentions were unclear with regard to her council duties. Meanwhile, Karen Handley had 'stepped into the breach' and so the meeting went ahead.

During the public forum, 'Japp'. The instructor in charge of the Ferry Lane Youth Workshops, stated that complaints had been made about the untidiness of the site, noise from the radio controlled cars and motorcycles being used on the premises.

He said work is progressing on tidying up the area and he will be submitting a planning application for 'change of use'.

The council expressed some reservations about the plans but will await the application. The council were told that the planning application for 23 houses on the school site was now withdrawn, but a new one had been put forward. Next meeting 14th May (A.G.M.)

MEETING 14th MAY (A.G.M. and ORDINARY MEETING)

Five councillors present plus District Councillor Mike Powell and three members of the public.

Chairman Glynn Pout thanked the members for their support over the year and was re-elected as chairman with Cllr. T.Carroll as vice chair. The sterling work already done by the new

clerk in sorting out some of the paper work she inherited was much appreciated by the council who voted to make her position official. Council meetings will be held monthly until all matters are brought into order. The new planning application for 21 houses on the school site was considered and the council agreed their feelings were unaltered as the reduction was deemed insufficient.

There will be a village inspection by council members and an official of the Highways Dept. On 16th June at 1.00pm.

It was stated that drainage work was planned on Church Lane in August 2008. The clerk will contact Highways Dept. about the bad condition of the brickwork on the first bridge on Mill Lane. Renovation will be done to the notice board on the 'Triangle'. Meeting closed at 9.30pm. Next meeting 11th June

Mr & Mrs Armitage have had their fence on Main Street knocked down yet again by a car. Pc Daniels was asked to comment on what action could be taken by the police. The use of radar guns is difficult because of availability due to funding problems. A representative of the Parish Council will attend the next meeting of the local police panel to ascertain what can be done. (Highways Department were made aware of this problem on 16th June and there may be improvements made to the road surface).

MEETING 10th SEPTEMBER

Six councillors present plus District Councillor Mike Powell, and one member of the public.

In the open forum the council were asked if anything can be done about the unkempt look of our village i.e.; old signs, grass cutting on verges, school field and the 'Triangle'. All need regular attention. Council promised to contact the education authority about the school field and the relevant departments concerning the verges.

Budget planning for the year and the precept were discussed at some length and requests for cash help were agreed for the Billingham swimming pool (£100); North Kyme Newsletter (£80); St Lukes Church grass cutting (£200).

The clerk told the meeting that the Audit Commission have informed her various matters have not been dealt with properly in the past and that they must be attended to a.s.a.p. The accounts year ending 2007 have not been satisfactorily dealt with and must be treated as urgent. Mrs Handley took over the clerk's job early this year and has already worked extremely hard in trying to sort out the confusion of paperwork she inherited from her predecessor.

Finally, the council discussed an annual parish meeting to be organised the first one to be in May 2009.
